Explanatory Notes

The results of GCSE examinations, including those for Short Courses, are reported on an eight-point grade scale: A*, A, B, C, D, E, F and G, of which A* is the highest and G the lowest. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard required for grade G are shown as Unclassified. Only subjects in which grades A* to G are attained will be recorded on certificates.

The results of GCSE Double Award examinations are reported on a fifteen-point grade scale: A*A*, A*A, AA, AB, BB, BC, CC, CD, DD, DE, EE, EF, FF, FG and GG, of which A*A* is the highest and GG the lowest. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard for grade GG are shown as Unclassified. Only subjects in which grades A*A* to GG are attained will be recorded on certificates.

Candidates who have achieved sufficient unit results for an award but have not claimed certification may do so retrospectively through their centre. The centre must submit requests by 20 September 2011 for the June 2011 series.

The results of GCSE unit examinations are reported on an eight-point grade scale: a*, a, b, c, d, e, f and g, of which a* is the highest and g the lowest. In addition, the candidate's uniform mark achieved and the maximum uniform mark available for each unit are reported. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard required for grade g are shown as Unclassified.

In Mathematics units B271 (M1) and B272 (M2) an additional grade p may be awarded. Grade p indicates that the candidate has achieved at least the minimum raw mark necessary to access the uniform mark scale for that unit but gained insufficient uniform marks to merit grade g. Grade p is awarded only at unit level and is not a valid grade for GCSE Mathematics.

The results of Level 2 Principal Learning subject awards are reported on a four-point grade scale: A*, A, B and C, of which A* is the highest and C the lowest. In addition, the candidate's points achieved and the maximum points available are reported. Candidates who fail to reach the minimum standard required for grade C are shown as Unclassified. Only subject awards in which grades A* to C are attained will be recorded on certificates.

Candidates who have achieved sufficient unit results for an award but have not claimed certification may do so retrospectively through their centre. The centre must submit requests by 20 September 2011 for the June 2011 series.
